

1. The 50 & 100 yard Ranges are one directional (South Berm) & available to Members & their guests at all times. These Bays are NEVER reserved. No Steel targets are ever allowed on these ranges.

2. The CHL/LTC range is one-directional (South Berm) & may be used (shared) by members (for no additional fee) when not reserved and in use by an instructor or Guns Plus staff for training or firearms testing. NO shotguns or Steel targets may be used on the CHL/LTC Range.

3. Tac Bay A is one directional (West Berm) & available to Members & their guests at all times. This Bay is NEVER reserved. No Steel targets are ever allowed on this range.

4. Tac Bay B is a 180° range (North Inset Berm as well as West & South Berms) & available to Members & their guests at all times. This Bay is NEVER reserved. No Steel targets are ever allowed in this Bay.

5. Tac Bay C is a 90° range (West & South Berms). It is often reserved by Instructors & Guns Plus employees, and may be rented (but not reserved in advance) by Full Members when not in use. This Bay may not be used unless it is being paid for, it is NOT a shared use Bay. Approved steel targets are allowed on the West Berm only. See Range Rules # 34 & 35.

6. Tac Bays D (West & North Berms) & E (West & South Berms) are 90° ranges and may be reserved by Instructors & Guns Plus employees. When not reserved they are available for shared use by all members. Approved steel targets are allowed on the West Berms only.

7. Target stands must be placed within three (3) feet of the base of a berm. Targets may NOT be placed on the berms, in the range lanes between the firing line and the target area.¹ Targets cannot be angled, but rather must be placed parallel to berms. NO TARGETS MAY BE PLACED DIRECTLY ON THE GROUND ANYWHERE. Shooters wishing to shoot shorter distances must establish and maintain a firing line closer to the targets, do not move the targets away from the berms.

- 8. No climbing or digging on or around the berms. Rocks, regardless of size, should not be moved or relocated.
- 9. No firing from a prone position on the ground is allowed on any range.

¹ NOTE: Clay targets are an exception to this rule. See Range Rule # 30.
